The court sat in judgement, and the books were opened. As I watched in the night visions, I saw one like a human being coming with the clouds of heaven. And he came to the Ancient One and was presented before him. To him was given dominion and glory and kingship, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not pass away, and his kingship is one that shall never be destroyed.

Luke 9. 28-36

Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as

they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah' - not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, 'This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!' When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.

Luc 9. 28-36

Ynghylch wyth diwrnod wedi iddo ddweud hyn, cymerodd Pedr ac Ioan ac Iago gydag ef a mynd i fyny'r mynydd i weddio. Tra oedd ef yn gweddio, newidiodd gwedd ei wyneb a disgleiriodd ei wisg yn llachar wyn. A dyma ddau ddyn yn ymddiddan ag ef; Moses ac Elias oeddent, wedi ymddangos mewn gogoniant ac yn siarad am ei ymadawiad, y weithred yr oedd i'w chyflawni yn Jerwsalem. Yr oedd Pedr a'r rhai oedd gydag ef wedi eu llethu gan gwsg; ond deffroesant a gweld ei ogoniant ef, a'r ddau ddyn oedd yn sefyll gydag ef. Wrth i'r rheini ymadael â Iesu, dywedodd Pedr wrtho, "Meistr, y mae'n dda ein bod ni yma; gwnawn dair pabell, un i ti ac un i Moses ac un i Elias." Ni wyddai beth yr oedd yn ei ddweud. Tra oedd yn dweud hyn, daeth cwmwl a chysgodi drostynt, a chydiodd ofn ynddynt wrth iddynt fynd i mewn i'r cwmwl. Yna daeth llais o'r cwmwl yn dweud, "Hwn yw fy Mab, yr Etholedig; gwrandewch arno." Ac wedi i'r llais lefaru cafwyd Iesu wrtho'i hun. A bu'r disgyblion yn ddistaw, heb ddweud wrth neb y pryd hwnnw am yr hyn yr oeddent wedi ei weld.

Carved Celtic Christian crosses from before the present Cathedral was built, will be seen in the building where the medieval Bishops' gaol used to be, behind a double portcullis. Cathedral Treasury - On public display in the Cathedral Treasury are rare artefacts and communion ware from the medieval, Tudor, Stuart and later periods. In the Library cases is one of the Cathedral's copies of the 403-year-old Welsh Bible from 1620 with its original wooden covers. Proceeds from the Donation Box go towards conservation and care of the Cathedral's Collection of Rare Books and artefacts.

Tours of Rarely Seen parts of St Davids Cathedral – The next Tour in this series is on Thursday 24th August 2pm - 3.30pm

An opportunity to view some parts of this special building that are rarely seen. You will see rare surviving medieval paintings that would have originally covered the inside of the building with masses of colour. Experience the almost mystical acoustic of the prayer niches in St David's shrine, one of very few surviving medieval shrines. Find medieval carving of Reynard the Fox, and more recent charming carved wooden mice. NB each Tour is slightly different. Meet in south nave aisle.
