## Collects and Readings for the Eucharist

#### Collect

Almighty God, whose Son Jesus Christ is the resurrection and the life: raise us, who trust in him, from the death of sin to the life of righteousness, that we may seek those things which are above, where he reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.** 

#### Colect

Hollalluog Dduw, dy Fab Iesu Grist yw'r atgyfodiad a'r bywyd: cyfoda ni, sy'n ymddiried ynddo ef, o farwolaeth pechod i fywyd cyfiawnder, fel y ceisiwn y pethau hynny sydd uchod lle y mae ef yn teyrnasu gyda thi yn undod yr Ysbryd Glân, yn un Duw, yn awr a hyd byth. **Amen.** 

#### Genesis 7. 1-5, 11-18; 8. 6-18; 9. 8-13

Then the Lord said to Noah, 'Go into the ark, you and all your household, for I have seen that you alone are righteous before me in this generation. Take with you seven pairs of all clean animals, the male and its mate; and a pair of the animals that are not clean, the male and its mate; and seven pairs of the birds of the air also, male and female, to keep their kind alive on the face of all the earth. For in seven days I will send rain on the earth for forty days and forty nights; and every living thing that I have made I will blot out from the face of the ground.' And Noah did all that the Lord had commanded him. In the six-hundredth year of Noah's life, in the second month, on the seventeenth day of the month, on that day all the fountains of the great deep burst forth, and the windows of the heavens were opened. The rain fell on the earth for forty days and forty nights. On the very same day Noah with his sons, Shem and Ham and Japheth, and Noah's wife and the three wives of his sons, entered the ark, they and every wild animal of every kind, and all domestic animals of every kind, and every creeping thing that creeps on the earth, and every bird of every kind - every bird, every winged creature. They went into the ark with Noah, two and two of all flesh in which there was the breath of life. And those that entered, male and female of all flesh, went in as God had commanded him; and the Lord shut him in. The flood continued for forty days on the earth; and the waters increased, and bore up the ark, and it rose high above the earth. The waters swelled and increased greatly on the earth; and the ark floated on the face of the waters. At the end of forty days Noah opened the window of the ark that he had made and sent out the raven; and it went to and fro until the waters were dried up from the earth. Then he sent out the dove from him, to see if the waters had subsided from the face of the ground; but the dove found no place to set its foot, and it returned to him to the ark, for the waters were still on the face of the whole earth. So he put out his hand and took it and brought it into the ark with him. He waited another seven days, and again he sent out the dove from the ark; and the dove came back to him in the evening, and there in its beak was a freshly plucked olive leaf; so Noah knew that the waters had subsided from the earth. Then he waited another seven days, and sent out the dove; and it did not return to him any more. In the six hundred and first year, in the first month, on the first day of the month, the waters were dried up from the earth; and Noah removed the covering of the ark, and looked, and saw that the face of the ground was drying. In the second month, on the twenty-seventh day of the month, the earth was dry. Then God said to Noah, 'Go out of the ark, you and your wife, and your sons and your sons' wives with you. Bring out with you every living thing that is with you of all flesh - birds and animals and every creeping thing that creeps on the earth - so that they may abound on the earth, and be fruitful and multiply on the earth.' So Noah went out with his sons and his wife and his sons' wives. Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him, 'As for me, I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you, and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark. I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth.' God said, 'This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth.

#### Genesis 7. 1-5, 11-18; 8. 6-18; 9. 8-13

Yna dywedodd yr Arglwydd wrth Noa, "Dos i mewn i'r arch, ti a'th holl deulu, oherwydd gwelais dy fod di yn gyfiawn ger fy mron yn y genhedlaeth hon. Cymer gyda thi saith bâr o'r holl anifeiliaid glân, y gwryw a'i gymar; a phâr o'r anifeiliaid nad ydynt lân, y gwryw a'i gymar; a phob yn saith bâr hefyd o adar yr awyr, y gwryw a'r fenyw, i gadw eu hil yn fyw ar wyneb yr holl ddaear. Oherwydd ymhen saith diwrnod paraf iddi lawio ar y ddaear am ddeugain diwrnod a deugain nos, a byddaf yn dileu oddi ar wyneb y ddaear bopeth byw a wneuthum." Gwnaeth Noa bopeth fel y gorchmynnodd yr Arglwydd iddo. Yn y chwe chanfed flwyddyn o oes Noa, yn yr ail fis, ar yr ail ddydd ar bymtheg o'r mis, y diwrnod hwnnw rhwygwyd holl ffynhonnau'r dyfnder mawr ac agorwyd ffenestri'r nefoedd, fel y bu'n glawio ar y ddaear am ddeugain diwrnod a deugain nos. Y diwrnod hwnnw aeth Noa a'i feibion Sem, Cham a Jaffeth, gwraig Noa a thair gwraig ei feibion hefyd gyda hwy i mewn i'r arch, hwy a phob bwystfil yn ôl ei rywogaeth, a phob anifail yn ôl ei rywogaeth, a phob peth sy'n ymlusgo ar y ddaear yn ôl ei rywogaeth, a'r holl adar yn ôl eu rhywogaeth, pob aderyn asgellog. Daethant at Noa i'r arch bob yn ddau, o bob creadur ag anadl einioes ynddo. Yr oeddent yn dod yn wryw ac yn fenyw o bob creadur, ac aethant i mewn fel y gorchmynnodd Duw iddo; a chaeodd yr Arglwydd arno. Am ddeugain diwrnod y bu'r dilyw yn dod ar y ddaear; amlhaodd y dyfroedd, gan gludo'r arch a'i chodi oddi ar y ddaear. Cryfhaodd y dyfroedd ac amlhau'n ddirfawr ar y ddaear, a moriodd yr arch ar wyneb y dyfroedd. Ymhen deugain diwrnod agorodd Noa y ffenestr yr oedd wedi ei gwneud yn yr arch, ac anfon allan gigfran i weld a oedd y dyfroedd wedi treio, ac aeth hithau yma ac acw nes i'r dyfroedd sychu oddi ar y ddaear. Yna gollyngodd golomen i weld a oedd y dyfroedd wedi treio oddi ar wyneb y tir; ond ni chafodd y golomen le i roi ei throed i lawr, a dychwelodd ato i'r arch am fod dŵr dros wyneb yr holl ddaear. Estynnodd yntau ei law i'w derbyn, a'i chymryd ato i'r arch. Arhosodd eto saith diwrnod, ac anfonodd y golomen eilwaith o'r arch. Pan ddychwelodd y golomen ato gyda'r hwyr, yr oedd yn ei phig ddeilen olewydd newydd ei thynnu; a deallodd Noa fod y dyfroedd wedi treio oddi ar y ddaear. Arhosodd eto saith diwrnod; anfonodd allan y golomen, ond ni ddaeth yn ôl ato y tro hwn. Yn y flwyddyn chwe chant ac un o oed Noa, yn y mis cyntaf, ar y dydd cyntaf o'r mis, sychodd y dyfroedd oddi ar y ddaear; a symudodd Noa gaead yr arch, a phan edrychodd allan, gwelodd wyneb y tir yn sychu. Erbyn yr ail fis, ar y seithfed dydd ar hugain o'r mis, yr oedd y ddaear wedi sychu. Yna llefarodd Duw wrth Noa, a dweud, "Dos allan o'r arch, ti a'th wraig a'th feibion a gwragedd dy feibion gyda thi; a dwg allan gyda thi bob creadur byw o bob cnawd, yn adar ac anifeiliaid a phopeth sy'n ymlusgo ar y ddaear, er mwyn iddynt epilio ar y ddaear, a ffrwytho ac amlhau ynddi." Felly aeth Noa allan gyda'i feibion a'i wraig a gwragedd ei feibion; Llefarodd Duw wrth Noa a'i feibion, a dweud, "Dyma fi'n sefydlu fy nghyfamod â chwi ac â'ch had ar eich ôl, ac â phob creadur byw gyda chwi, yn adar ac anifeiliaid, a'r holl fwystfilod gwyllt sydd gyda chwi, y cwbl a ddaeth allan o'r arch. Sefydlaf fy nghyfamod â chwi, rhag torri ymaith eto bob cnawd trwy ddyfroedd dilyw, na bod dilyw arall i ddifa'r ddaear." A dywedodd Duw, "Dyma a osodaf yn arwydd o'r cyfamod yr wyf yn ei wneud â chwi ac â phopeth byw gyda chwi tros oesoedd di-rif: gosodaf fy mwa yn y cwmwl, a bydd yn arwydd cyfamod rhyngof a'r ddaear.

#### Acts 4. 5-12

The next day their rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, 'By what power or by what name did you do this?' Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, 'Rulers of the people and elders, if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed, let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. This Jesus is "the stone that was rejected by you, the builders; it has become the cornerstone." There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among mortals by which we must be saved.'

#### Actau 4. 5-12

Trannoeth bu cyfarfod o lywodraethwyr a henuriaid ac ysgrifenyddion yr Iddewon yn Jerwsalem. Yr oedd Annas yr archoffeiriad yno, a Caiaffas ac Ioan ac Alexander a phawb oedd o deulu archoffeiriadol. Rhoesant y carcharorion i sefyll gerbron, a dechrau eu holi, "Trwy ba nerth neu drwy ba enw y gwnaethoch chwi hyn?" Yna, wedi ei lenwi â'r Ysbryd Glân, dywedodd Pedr wrthynt: "Lywodraethwyr y bobl, a henuriaid, os ydym ni heddiw yn cael ein croesholi am gymwynas i ddyn claf, a sut y mae wedi cael ei iacháu, bydded hysbys i chwi i gyd ac i holl bobl Israel mai trwy enw Iesu Grist o Nasareth, a groeshoeliasoch chwi ac a gyfododd Duw oddi wrth y meirw, trwy ei enw ef y mae hwn yn sefyll ger eich bron yn iach. Iesu yw 'Y maen a ddiystyrwyd gennych chwi yr adeiladwyr, ac a ddaeth yn faen y gongl.' Ac nid oes iachawdwriaeth yn neb arall, oblegid nid oes enw arall dan y nef, wedi ei roi i'r ddynolryw, y mae'n rhaid i ni gael ein hachub drwyddo."

#### John 10. 11-18

Jesus said, 'I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away - and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father.'

**Cathedral Library** - The Cathedral Library is open to the public on Fridays and Mondays 2pm to 4pm. No bookings needed. The Library is reached via a spiral medieval stone staircase adjacent to the Shrine of St David in the north presbytery aisle.

**Cathedral Treasury** - On public display in the Cathedral Treasury are rare artefacts and communion ware from the medieval, Tudor, Stuart and later periods. In the Library cases is one of Page 9
