## Colect

## Amos 7. 7-15

This is what he showed me: the Lord was standing beside a wall built with a plumb-line, with a plumb-line in his hand. And the Lord said to me, 'Amos, what do you see?' And I said, 'A plumb-line.' Then the Lord said, 'See, I am setting a plumb-line in the midst of my people Israel; I will never again pass them by; the high places of Isaac shall be made desolate, and the sanctuaries of Israel shall be laid waste, and I will rise against the house of Jeroboam with the sword.' Then Amaziah, the priest of Bethel, sent to King Jeroboam of Israel, saying, 'Amos has conspired against you in the very centre of the house of Israel; the land is not able to bear all his words. For thus Amos has said, "Jeroboam shall die by the sword, and Israel must go into exile away from his land." ' And Amaziah said to Amos, 'O seer, go, flee away to the land of Judah, earn your bread there, and prophesy there; but never again prophesy at Bethel, for it is the king's sanctuary, and it is a temple of the kingdom.' Then Amos answered Amaziah, 'I am no prophet, nor a prophet's son; but I am a herdsman, and a dresser of sycomore trees, and the Lord took me from following the flock, and the Lord said to me, "Go, prophesy to my people Israel."

## Amos 7. 7-15

Fel hyn y dangosodd i mi: dyma'r Arglwydd yn sefyll ger mur a godwyd â llinyn plwm, a'r llinyn plwm yn ei law. A dywedodd yr Argwlydd wrthyf, "Beth a weli, Amos?" Atebais innau, "Llinyn plwm." A dywedodd yr Arglwydd, "Wele fi'n gosod llinyn plwm yng nghanol fy mhobl Israel; nid af heibio iddynt byth eto. Difodir uchelfeydd Isaac a distrywir cysegrleoedd Israel; a chodaf gleddyf yn erbyn tŷ Jeroboam." Yna anfonodd Amaseia offeiriad Bethel at Jeroboam brenin Israel i ddweud, "Cynllwyniodd Amos yn dy erbyn yng nghanol tŷ Israel; ni all y wlad oddef ei holl eiriau. Oherwydd fel hyn y dywed Amos: 'Bydd Jeroboam yn marw trwy'r cleddyf, ac Israel yn mynd i gaethglud ymhell o'u gwlad.'" A dywedodd Amaseia wrth Amos, "Dos ymaith, weledydd; ffo i wlad Jwda; ennill dy damaid yno, a phroffwyda yno. Paid â phroffwydo ym Methel eto, gan mai dyma gysegr y brenin a theml y wladwriaeth." Ond atebodd Amos a dweud wrth Amaseia, "Nid

oeddwn i'n broffwyd, nac yn fab i broffwyd chwaith; bugail oeddwn i, a garddwr coed sycamor; ond cymerodd yr Argwlydd fi oddi wrth y praidd, a dywedodd yr Argwlydd wrthyf, 'Dos i broffwydo i'm pobl Israel.'

### **Ephesians 1. 3-14**

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance towards redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

### **Effesiaid 1. 3-14**

Bendigedig fyddo Duw a Thad ein Harglwydd Iesu Grist! Y mae wedi'n bendithio ni yng Nghrist â phob bendith ysbrydol yn y nefolion leoedd. Cyn seilio'r byd, fe'n dewisodd yng Nghrist i fod yn sanctaidd ac yn ddi-fai ger ei fron mewn cariad. O wirfodd ei ewyllys fe'n rhagordeiniodd i gael ein mabwysiadu yn blant iddo'i hun trwy Iesu Grist, er clod i'w ras gogoneddus, ei rad rodd i ni yn yr Anwylyd. Ynddo ef y mae i ni brynedigaeth trwy ei waed, sef maddeuant ein camweddu; dyma fesur cyfoeth y gras a roddodd mor hael i ni, ynghyd â phob doethineb a dirnadaeth. Hysbysodd i ni ddirgelwch ei ewyllys, yn unol â'r bwriad a arfaethodd yng Nghrist yng nghynllun cyflawniad yr amseroedd, sef dwyn yr holl greadigaeth i undod yng Nghrist, gan gynnwys pob peth yn y nefoedd ac ar y ddaear. Ynddo ef hefyd rhoddwyd i ni ran yn yr etifeddiaeth, yn rhinwedd ein rhagordeinio yn ôl arfaeth yr hwn sy'n gweithredu pob peth yn ôl ei fwriad a'i ewyllys ei hun. A thrwy hyn yr ydym ni, y rhai cyntaf i obeithio yng Nghrist, i ddwyn clod i'w ogoniant ef. A chwithau, wedi ichwi glywed gair y gwirionedd, Efengyl eich iachawdwriaeth, ac wedi ichwi gredu ynddo, gosodwyd arnoch yng Nghrist sêl yr Ysbryd Glân, yr hwn oedd wedi ei addo. Yr Ysbryd hwn yw'r ernes o'n hetifeddiaeth, nes ein prynu'n rhydd i'w meddiannu'n llawn, er clod i ogoniant Duw.

I will listen to what the Lord God will say: for he shall speak peace to his people and to the faithful, that they turn not again to folly.

Truly, his salvation is near to those who fear him: that his glory may dwell in our land.  
Mercy and truth are met together: righteousness and peace have kissed each other;  
Truth shall spring up from the earth: and righteousness look down from heaven.  
The Lord will indeed give all that is good: and our land will yield its increase.  
Righteousness shall go before him: and direct his steps in the way.

### **Mark 6. 14-29**

King Herod heard of it, for Jesus' name had become known. Some were saying, 'John the baptizer has been raised from the dead; and for this reason these powers are at work in him.' But others said, 'It is Elijah.' And others said, 'It is a prophet, like one of the prophets of old.' But when Herod heard of it, he said, 'John, whom I beheaded, has been raised.' For Herod himself had sent men who arrested John, bound him, and put him in prison on account of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, because Herod had married her. For John had been telling Herod, 'It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife.' And Herodias had a grudge against him, and wanted to kill him. But she could not, for Herod feared John, knowing that he was a righteous and holy man, and he protected him. When he heard him, he was greatly perplexed; and yet he liked to listen to him. But an opportunity came when Herod on his birthday gave a banquet for his courtiers and officers and for the leaders of Galilee. When his daughter Herodias came in and danced, she pleased Herod and his guests; and the king said to the girl, 'Ask me for whatever you wish, and I will give it.' And he solemnly swore to her, 'Whatever you ask me, I will give you, even half of my kingdom.' She went out and said to her mother, 'What should I ask for?' She replied, 'The head of John the baptizer.' Immediately she rushed back to the king and requested, 'I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptist on a platter.' The king was deeply grieved; yet out of regard for his oaths and for the guests, he did not want to refuse her. Immediately the king sent a soldier of the guard with orders to bring John's head. He went and beheaded him in the prison, brought his head on a platter, and gave it to the girl. Then the girl gave it to her mother. When his disciples heard about it, they came and took his body, and laid it in a tomb.

## **Marc 6. 14-29**

Clywodd y Brenin Herod am hyn, oherwydd yr oedd enw Iesu wedi dod yn hysbys. Yr oedd pobl yn dweud, "Ioan Fedyddiwr sydd wedi ei godi oddi wrth y meirw, a dyna pam y mae'r gweithredoedd nerthol ar waith ynddo ef." Yr oedd eraill yn dweud, "Elias ydyw"; ac eraill wedyn, "Proffwyd yw, fel un o'r proffwydi gynt." Ond pan glywodd Herod, dywedodd, "Ioan, yr un y torrais i ei ben, sydd wedi ei gyfodi." Oherwydd yr oedd Herod wedi anfon a dal Ioan, a'i roi yn rhwym yng ngharchar o achos Herodias, gwraig Philip ei frawd, am ei fod wedi ei phriodi. Yr oedd Ioan wedi dweud wrth Herod, "Nid yw'n gyfreithlon iti gael gwraig dy frawd." Ac yr oedd Herodias yn dal dig wrtho ac yn dymuno ei ladd, ond ni allai, oherwydd yr oedd ar Herod ofn Ioan, am ei fod yn gwybod mai gŵr cyfiawn a sanctaidd ydoedd. Yr oedd yn ei gadw dan warchodaeth; a byddai'n gwrando arno'n llawen, er ei fod, ar ôl gwrando, mewn penbleth fawr. Daeth cyfle un diwrnod, pan wnaeth Herod wledd ar ei ben-blwydd i'w bendefigion a'i gadfridogion a gwŷr blaenllaw Galilea. Daeth merch Herodias i mewn, a dawnsio a phlesio Herod a'i westeion. Dywedodd y brenin wrth yr eneth, "Gofyn imi am y peth a fynni, ac fe'i rhof iti." A gwnaeth lw difrifol iddi, "Beth bynnag a ofynni gennyf, rhof ef iti, hyd at hanner fy nheyrnas." Aeth allan a dywedodd wrth ei mam, "Am beth y caf ofyn?" Dywedodd hithau, "Pen Ioan Fedyddiwr." A brysiodd yr eneth ar unwaith i mewn at y brenin a gofyn, "Yr wyf am iti roi imi, y munud yma, ben Ioan Fedyddiwr ar ddysgl." Aeth y brenin yn drist iawn, ond oherwydd ei lw, ac oherwydd y gwesteion, penderfynodd beidio â thorri ei air iddi. Ac yna anfonodd y brenin ddiennyddiwr a gorchymyn iddo ddod â phen Ioan. Fe aeth hwnnw, a thorodd ei ben ef yn y carchar, a dod ag ef ar ddysgl a'i roi i'r eneth; a rhoddodd yr eneth ef i'w mam. A phan glywodd ei ddisgyblion, daethant, a mynd â'i gorff ymaith a'i ddodi mewn bedd.

### **CATHEDRAL LIBRARY**

The Cathedral Library is open to the public on Fridays and Mondays 2pm to 4pm. No bookings needed. The Library is reached via a spiral medieval stone staircase adjacent to the Shrine of St David in the north presbytery aisle.

**CATHEDRAL TREASURY** - On public display in the Cathedral Treasury are rare medieval artefacts as well as communion ware from the medieval, Tudor, Stuart and later periods. In the Library cases is one of the Cathedral's copies of the 404-year-old Welsh Bible from 1620 with its original wooden covers. Proceeds from the Donation Box go towards conservation and care of the Cathedral's Collection of Rare Books and artefacts. There are also displays in the exhibition cases in the north transept. If you open the top left viewing drawer you will see a small exquisite medieval bronze Corpus Christi figure, probably 13<sup>th</sup> century and possibly French in origin. It was found in fields near the Cathedral and is being publicly displayed in the Cathedral on behalf of its owners, St Davids and Dewisland Historical Society.

### **BRITISH ARCHAEOLOGY ASSOCIATION Annual Conference**

St Davids Cathedral is pleased to welcome the prestigious British Archaeology Association (BAA) for their 2024 annual conference. Study visits will be held for BAA members in particular venues around the Cathedral on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> July. Particular locations around the cathedral include the Bishop Gower Pulpitum screen, the tomb of Edmund Tudor, the medieval croziers in the Treasury, the Shrine of St David, St Mary's College Chapel and the Cathedral Library.
