Colect

Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, 'Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch.' Simon answered, 'Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets.' When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. So they signalled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, 'Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!' For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people.' When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.

Luc 5. 1-11

Pan welodd Simon Pedr hyn syrthiodd wrth liniau Iesu gan ddweud, "Dos ymaith oddi wrthyf, oherwydd dyn pechadurus wyf fi, Arglwydd." Yr oedd ef, a phawb oedd gydag ef, wedi eu syfrdanu o weld y llwyth pysgod yr oeddent wedi eu dal; a'r un modd Iago ac Ioan, meibion Sebedeus, a oedd yn bartneriaid i Simon. Ac meddai

Conversations on Same Sex Marriage and Blessings

This spring the Bishops of the Church in Wales are holding conversations across each diocese as part of a discernment process around the Experimental Rite allowing clergy to bless the marriage or civil partnership of couples already married or partnered in a civil ceremony. The five year period for this ends in September 2026, and the Governing Body must decide what happens next: whether to extend permission for its use beyond September 2026 or let it lapse. The Bishops believe this decision requires this shared discernment, including through the prayerful listening and discussion which marks all good decision making under God. As a first step, our Bishop is holding conversations across Local Ministry Areas which are open to all. The meeting for the Cathedral Parish and Greater Dewisland LMA will be held in **Llanrhian Church Hall on Tuesday 11 February from 7 to 8.30pm** (with refreshments available beforehand). This is an invitation

to the Church to listen together to one another and to the Holy Spirit and to give the people of God opportunity to express their views, hopes and concerns in a way which is marked by a spirit of generosity, mutual respect and love - rather than being a time for discussion or debate. Everyone is welcome to attend. If anyone would like further information, please speak to one of the clergy.

CATHEDRAL LIBRARY

Come and see what was written on the life of St David, and the way Easter has been depicted over the centuries.

CATHEDRAL TREASURY - On public display in the Cathedral Treasury are rare medieval artefacts as well as communion ware from the medieval, Tudor, Stuart and later periods. In the Library cases is one of the Cathedral's copies of the 405-year-old Welsh Bible from 1620 with its original wooden covers. There are also displays from the Library Collection in the exhibition cases in the north transept. Contributions into the Donation Box in the Treasury are much appreciated and go towards conservation and care of the Cathedral's Collection of Rare Books and artefacts.
