The Cathedral's historic library is open to the public twice a week on Monday and Friday between 2pm to 4pm. No bookings are needed at these times. For special research enquiries and access, please apply to: Library@StDavidsCathedral.org.uk. The Library is reached via a spiral medieval stone staircase adjacent to the Shrine of St David in the north presbytery aisle. On display are working books from the cathedral over the last 500 years; including some of the first Bibles in Welsh, early Prayer Books, Visitors Books, drawings, atlases and more. Items from the historic Library collection are also on display in exhibition cases in the north transept and Treasury.

Whenever the Cathedral is open to the public, we ensure that one of the first Welsh Bibles is on public display in the Cathedral Treasury. At present it is one in the Cathedral Library collection that was produced in 1620. Elizabeth I ensured legislation was passed to require there would be “a Bible in Welsh in every village in Wales.” This was the major project of the Reformation in Wales and was key to maintaining the Welsh language. The one on display shows evidence of its use in worship over its 400 and more years.

We don't receive any government support and we don't have millions stashed in the bank.

We're looking for 1% of the 200,000 people who visit each year to step up and help the Cathedral to secure a firmer financial footing.

If 1% of our visitors gave **just £10 a month** to the Cathedral, we would close this financial gap.

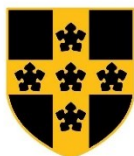
And if 1000 people gave £10 a month we would raise £120,000.
